

Spending Transparency Bills Passed:

39

- 2007: Hawaii, Kansas, Minnesota, Oklahoma, Texas
2008: Arizona, Georgia, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, Ohio, Utah, Washington
2009: Alabama, California, Colorado, Delaware, Florida, Hawaii, Illinois, Michigan, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oregon, South Carolina, Utah, Virginia, Wyoming
2010: Arizona, Mississippi, New Hampshire, New Mexico, Oklahoma
- AL, CO, HI, MO, MS, NE, VA, UT expand previous bills or codify executive efforts into statute
 - FL and UT are the first ones to enact a local transparency requirement
 - SC added a requirement for school district transparency to school district administration bill
 - MI passed a requirement for school district transparency to K-12 budget
 - DE requires all school districts to post their check registers online
 - OK passed two bills – one expands previous legislation; the other requires school district transparency
 - AZ passed two bills – one requires statewide transparency; the other requires local & school district transparency
- 2011: Iowa, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin
