

## Spending Transparency Bills Passed:

26

- 2007: Hawaii, Kansas, Minnesota, Oklahoma, Texas  
2008: Arizona, Georgia, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, Ohio, Utah, Washington  
2009: Alabama, Colorado, Florida, Hawaii, Illinois, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oregon, South Carolina, Utah, Virginia, Wyoming
- *OR, IL are awaiting governors' signature*
  - *AL, CO, HI, MO, NE, VA, UT expand previous bills or codify executive efforts into statute*
  - *FL and UT are the first ones to enact a local transparency requirement*
  - *SC added a requirement for school district transparency to school district administration bill*
