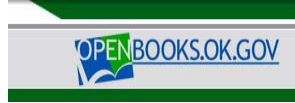

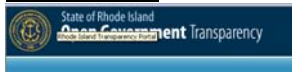

## Executive Orders/Passed Legislation Awaiting Implementation

### Executive Orders:

#### Delaware

- School districts to post their check registers online by September 1, 2009
- HB 119, by Rep. Teresa Schooley (D-Wilmington), and signed in August 2009

### Passed Legislation:

#### Alabama

- Website to be launched by October 1, 2010
- SB 204, by Sen. Arthur Orr (R-Decatur) and signed in May 2009

#### Arizona

- Website to be launched by 2011
- SB 1235, by Sen. Tom O'Halleran (R-Sedona), signed in July 2008

#### Florida

- No firm implementation date set
- SB 1796 by Sen. Alexander (R-Lake Wales), signed in May 2009

#### Hawaii (re-passing of bill administration failed to implement)

- Website to be launched by Jan. 2009 – administration says won't implement as mandated.
- HB 122, by Rep. Markus Oshiro (D-Wahiawa), became law without governor's signature in 2007
- SB 659, by Sen. Les Ihara (D-Kaimuki), and signed in July 2009

#### Michigan

- School districts must post spending information going forward
- Passed as amendment sponsored by Rep. Tom McMillin (R-Rochester Hills) to the K-12 School Aid budget.

#### Nebraska

- Website must be updated to meet new requirements by January 1, 2010
- SB 18, by Sen. Tom White (D-Omaha), signed in May 2009

#### North Dakota

- Website to be launched by June 30, 2011
- HB 1377, by Rep. Blair Thoreson (R-Fargo), later amended into SB 2018 and signed in May, 2009

#### Ohio

- Website to be launched no later than one year after effective date.
- HB 420, by Rep. Tom Brinkman (R-Mount Lookout), signed in December 2008

#### Oregon

- Website to be launched January 1, 2010
- HB 2500, by Reps. Arnie Roblan (D-Coos Bay), Jefferson Smith (D-Portland), Kim Thatcher (R-Keizer, Newberg, St. Paul), and Gene Whisnant (R-Sunriver), signed in July, 2009

#### Utah

- Localities to begin providing information on website by May 15, 2010
- SB 18, by Sen. Wayne Niederhauser (R-Sandy), signed in March 2009
